<i>Buddleia crispa x loricata</i> 'Silver Anniversary'	Silver Anniversary' Butterfly Bush	(Shrub 4-5 feet) (Zone 7) Bred by plantsman Peter Moore in England. Intensely silver leaves and highly scented white flowers. More vigorous than <i>crispa</i> or <i>loricata</i> .	1 gal	\$6
<i>Buddleia davidii</i> 'White Profusion'	White Profusion Butterfly Bush	(perennial/shrub) (Zone 5) White flowers.	1 gal	\$4
<i>Buddleia davidii</i> 'Black Knight'	Butterfly Bush Black Knight	(perennial/shrub, 8-10 feet) (Zone 5) Very dark purple flowers.	1 gal	\$4
<i>Buddleia davidii</i> 'Ellen's Blue'	Butterfly Bush Ellen's Blue	(perennial/shrub to 6 feet) (Zone 5) Blue flowers with grayish silver foliage	1 gal	\$4
<i>Buddleia davidii</i> 'Guinevere'	Butterfly Bush Guinevere	(perennial/shrub to 10 feet) (Zone 5) Black-purple, fragrant flowers and dark green foliage. A more robust grower than 'Black Knight'	1 gal	\$4
<i>Buddleia davidii</i> 'Royal Red'	Butterfly Bush Royal Red	(perennial/shrub) (Zone 5) Burgundy flowers	1 gal	\$4
<i>Buxus var. koreana x B. sempervirens</i>	Green Velvet Boxwood	(Shrub to 4 feet) (Zone 6) Rounded, full-bodied, slow-growing <i>Buxus</i> with small dark green leaves. 4' x4'	3 gal	\$12
<i>Callicarpa dichotoma</i> 'Issai'	Beautyberry Issai	(shrub to 3 feet) (Zone 5) An early flowering and fruiting cultivar with small violet fruit in the fall and winter. Small shrub with graceful branches and pink/violet berries in fall	3 gal	\$12
<i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i>	Oak Leaf Hydrangea	(Shrub to 8 feet) (Zone 5) White flowers in June and spectacular fall color.	3 gal	\$10
<i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i> 'Alice'	Oak Leaf Hydrangea "Alice"	(Shrub to 12 feet) (Zone 5) Larger habit, foliage, and flower than the species. Fast growing with 1 to 2 foot blooms that change to pink with time. Has replaced the other cultivars as the <i>quercifolia</i> of choice. More heat tolerant than any other. <i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i> 'Amethyst'	Oak Leaf Hydrangea "Amethyst"	(Shrub to 6 feet) (Zone 5) A compact growing oakleaf with 6 inch long white flowers that turn wine-red with age. This Michael Dirr selection makes a wonderful dry flower and seems destined to greatness.	Avail in 2010	NA
<i>Myrica cerifera</i>	Southern Wax Myrtle	Beautiful, wispy, broadleaf evergreen to 20'. Tolerant of salt spray and can be planted in full sun or half shade. Zone 7.	3 gal	\$8
<i>Lantana camera</i> 'Chapel Hill Yellow'	Chapel Hill Yellow Lantana	(2 Ft.) (Zone 7) A new release with brilliant yellow flowers and dark green foliage. A cross between 'Miss Huff' and 'New Gold'. Has the hardiness of 'Miss Huff' and the prostrate habit of 'New Gold'. Can be used as an annual or perennial.	1 gal	\$5
<i>Lantana camera</i> 'Chapel Hill Yellow'	Chapel Hill Gold Lantana	(2-3 Ft.) (Zone 7) A sport found on 'Chapel Hill Yellow'. Same wonderful foliage, growth habit and hardiness as 'Chapel Hill Yellow' but with gold flowers. Hardier, larger flowers than 'New Gold'.	1 gal	\$5
